

APPRENTICE-INSTRUCTOR

Training Program Courses & Internships

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

PRÉREQUISITE

Skiers must be 13 years old or over before January 1st, 2023 and have completed level "Adventure 1" or an equivalent. Snowboarders must be 14 years old or over before January 1st, 2023 and have completed level "Cruising" or an equivalent. The apprentice-instructor must be available every weekend (Saturdays and Sundays) from January 14th until March 12th, 2023.

TRAINING PROGRAM

9 training sessions are offered to the apprentice-instructors. During those trainings, they will learn the basics of teaching lessons, communicating and interacting with students, client services, while also improving their ski/snowboard technique.

5 observation internships are also offered to the apprentice-instructors. During those internships, they have the opportunity to see and better understand the reality pertaining to teaching and class management. The apprentice-instructors will also have the opportunity to do those internships in different types of courses and/or age groups. The internships will take place at precise dates and time schedule between January 14th and March 12th, 2023. The internships' schedule will be announced during the first day of training, on the weekend of January 14th and 15th, 2023. Take note that the internships will not take place on the same day as the trainings.

UNIFORM

Mont SUTTON Snow School issues a coat, free of charge, to the apprentice-instructors for the whole duration of the season. This coat must be worn with respect and kept clean at all times. It is strictly forbidden to smoke when wearing that uniform.

The coat will be handed to the apprentice-instructors during the first day of training, on the weekend of January 14th and 15th, 2023. This coat must be handed back at Mont SUTTON Snow School's front desk at the end of the training program. Please wash your coat before returning it.

MOUNTAIN CODE OF CONDUCT

When wearing the uniform handed by Mont SUTTON Snow School, the apprentice-instructors must respect the mountain code of conduct at all times. We will not tolerate any form of misconduct from the participants (off-track skiing, skiing in a closed trail, disrespect towards a client or a colleague, etc.).

SKI TICKETS

The apprentice-instructor has the responsibility to procure himself/herself a season pass or a daily ticket package (see School Card). The cost of the tickets is not included in the registration fees.
